6th Annual Halloween House Decorating Contest


ABSECON COMMUNITY AFFAIRS

The holidays are fast approaching and the hustle and bustle of this time of year is upon us. Please remember to be aware of your surroundings and be mindful of those who seek opportunities to take advantage of others. While shopping be sure to park in well-lit locations and in the company of others when possible. Remember to lock your vehicle and keep items of value hidden and out of sight.

Please remember when you “see something say something”. It is vitally important that when a suspected incident is occurring that it be reported immediately by dialing 911. We cannot act unless we are aware of these various incidents as they are happening. No call is too minor and no one is ever bothering us as we are here to serve you so remember to help us help you.

Daylight savings time is Sunday, November 7, 2021. With shorter days everyone will be operating vehicles and navigating in darkness. Pedestrian safety is crucial for both the driver and pedestrian. Not all pedestrians are clearly visible both walking on the shoulders and crossing the roadway. Please be extra cautious while sharing the roadway. Daylight savings time is also a great reminder to change your smoke detector batteries and ensure they are in working order.

We have many community events during the holiday season. The police department will be assisting everyone to ensure your safety. We will be participating with the neighboring police departments with Shop with a Cop as well as Toys for Kids. If anyone wants to donate a toy for any of these program’s there is a drop box in the lobby located at city hall. Please remember the gift of giving through this holiday season.

Cyber Crime & Consumer Fraud – November 17, 2021 at 5:00 PM at City Hall presented by Patrolman Keith Epstein and Detective Neal Galletta. This is aimed to educate and assist residents in preventing those from

becoming victims of numerous cyber-crimes that exist in our technology driven society. Ic3.gov is a great reference site for information and current trends in cyber-crime along with ways to report information to authorities. Community Camera Registration Program – Help the Absecon Police Department by making your private security camera a crime fighting tool. The Community Camera Registration Program is designed for residents and businesses to register their address as a location operating a security camera system. As security camera systems continue to become more affordable and desirable crime prevention tools, our Community Camera Registration Program offers an opportunity for citizens to partner with us to allow for the quick identification of possible locations where video evidence may be present following a crime.

The Community Camera Registration Program is strictly voluntary. If a criminal incident occurs in the vicinity of your camera the Absecon Police Department may contact you at the phone number or address included on your registration form. The Absecon Police Department will not be able to access video footage directly. Information provided to the Absecon Police Department will be for official use only. Our goal is to empower residents by taking a community wide approach to policing. We hope that you will join us in this initiative and help protect the community we all care about. 

BOAT RAMP PERMITS & PET LICENSING FOR 2022

Faunce Landing Boat Ramp Pass will be available beginning January 3rd, 2022. Regular Price - \$50.00 until April 1st & \$100.00 after April 1st. With Discount Any Time - \$25.00.

Required Documents: Copy of TRAILER registration - NJ Hunting or Fishing License - Veteran’s Status DD214 or Driver’s License with Vet Insignia.

Animal Licensing available January 3rd, 2022 Owners of all dogs/cats 7 months of age or older are required to annually apply to the Municipal Clerk for a dog/cat license. In order for the license to be issued, the owner must present proof that the animal has been vaccinated against rabies. Fees: For January 1st through March 31st: Neutered or spayed: \$7.00 Non-neutered or non-spayed: \$10.00 For April 1st through December 31st: Neutered or spayed: \$12.00 Non-neutered or non-spayed: \$15.00
