Yard Waste Reminders

TIPS FROM BOB BATTISTA

Please help to keep ABSECON clean:

• Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in paper kraft bags or in containers labeled yard waste.

• Brush and branches must be bundled and tied, not to exceed 4 foot in length and 8 inches in diameter.


• Per city ordinance, place items on the curb no sooner than 24 hours prior to collection day, and remove from the curb no later than 24 hours after collection day.

• No plastic bags for yard waste.

Please follow the ACUA schedule for yard waste, see website acua.com for collection day.
Trash, Recycling & Yard Waste containers must be stored on side or rear of the premises line opposite the principal front yard, except for corner properties, which shall be stored behind the rear building.

• Yard waste not properly disposed of can topple over, blow onto the street or neighbor's yards, clog storm drains, impede street cleaning and is unsightly in our neighborhoods.

As we move forward into 2021, I would like to thank all of our residents for working together as we continue to navigate through the COVID-19 pandemic. In time I hope that everyone has the opportunity to get vaccinated. Even if you receive the vaccination, it is important to remember to continue wearing face masks and practice safe social distancing. These practices are a sure way to help cure the virus and ensure everyone stays safe and healthy. While this past year has been challenging it is important to remember these safe practices to help get back to normalcy.

Unfortunately, when we face hard times criminals find new ways to victimize the public. If contacted by anyone who claims to be an agent working for the Internal Revenue Service or the Social Security Administration do not provide any personal information. Generally, Social Security will only contact you if you have requested a call or have ongoing business with the Administration. Both of these agencies will contact you by mail if there are any discrepancies. NEVER give personal information if you receive phone calls from these agencies. Fraudsters pretend to be government employees and claim there is identity theft or another problem with one's Social Security number, account, or benefits. If you receive any emails or phone calls from individuals posing as agents for Amazon, PayPal or any other companies do not provide any personal information and do not open any suspicious emails.

Please contact us if you receive any suspicious phone calls or emails if you are unsure. The Absecon Police Department can direct you and help prevent identity thefts and fraud. Contact our non-emergency phone number (609)641-0667 ext. 0. Another issue I would like to educate you about is the increase in motor vehicle thefts occurring in the Tri-State area. Perpetrators are looking for victims who leave their car running while they go into a store or conduct usual business. Please be vigilant and remember to lock your vehicles and belongings as you go about your day. With that said it is 2021 and those of you who leave your cars unlocked or your homes unsecured are leaving yourself vulnerable to preventable crimes. Try and be more cautious in locking your homes and property and remember to report any suspicious activity in our neighborhoods. Always call us even if you think it is a minor complaint. Help us help you as we continue to serve you and keep our neighborhoods safe.
